**Subject:** CAC Member Appointment for Vacant Positions

#### Introduction

The Board of Managers is required to maintain an advisory committee to advise and assist the Managers with all matters affecting the interests of the watershed district as well as to make recommendations on proposed RCWD projects and improvements. The Board appoints or re-appoints members annually or as vacancies occur.

#### Background

The "Advisory Committee Operating Procedures" (adopted in 2020) includes requirements for:

- A maximum of 12 members
- Up to 4 members from each of the counties of Anoka, Ramsey, and Washington (ideally) with one of those being a representative of the conservation district/department

There are 2 vacant spots on the CAC in 2025, 1 in Anoka County and 1 in Washington County. Staff received an application from an Anoka County resident. Washington County CD brought forth a representative, their new Board Supervisor, Matt Lindholm.

#### **Applicant Anoka County: Kate Asleson's Profile**

- Relevant Experience: Background in environmental science aids effective watershed management advice.
- Community Engagement: Involvement in local groups demonstrates a commitment to sustainable practices.
- Strong Communication Skills: Effective communication ensures community concerns are conveyed to the RCWD.
- Passion for Conservation: Genuine interest in environmental issues motivates active contribution to the CAC.

#### Washington County CD Board Rep: Matt Lindholm's Profile

- Background in cartography, environmental consulting, and city planning/code enforcement.
- Five years enforcing city codes affecting soil, water, and communities—balancing environmental protection and property rights.
- Prioritizes and cares about erosion/stormwater management practices at WCD and within watersheds.

#### Introduction

Date:

Informational item on Ramsey County Ditch #1 (RCD#1) Records Correction, As Constructed and Subsequently Improved Condition (ACSIC), public hearing and seeking Board input, further direction.

#### **Background**

On Wednesday, January 22, 2025, the Board held a public hearing on RCD#1; at the hearing, the Board took testimony from the public, and staff read into the record a letter from the DNR expressing concerns, not about the ACSIC determination, but rather about potential future public water impacts if the drainage system was ever repaired to the recommended ACSIC. Upon hearing testimony from the public and considering the letter from the DNR, the Board continued the public hearing to a future to be determined date.

The Board directed the District Engineer to examine the hydrological effects of lowering the culvert on County Road I by 1.5 feet to the proposed ASCIC and to further engage with the DNR on their submitted letter. Further, staff were directed to bring this matter to a future Board workshop to inform and discuss the comments and deliberation at the public hearing.

The engineer will present an abbreviated version of the presentation given at the public hearing, and staff and consultants will lead the board through a discussion on the comments shared during public testimony at the hearing. The testimony relates to the decision on the records correction for the drainage system and the District's potential courses of action. The Board may consider directing the engineer to prepare a detailed condition or repair report of the drainage system that may be used as a basis for future management of the drainage system and as an informative basis as the Board moves to an order on records correction.




# RCD 1 Location



# RCD 1 is a "Public Drainage System" generally flows south to north from Marsden wetland lake outlet to Rice Creek.



## RCD 1 Situated between County Road 3 and Lexington Ave.



## **Legal Standard for Hearing**

- If, after investigation of drainage system records, the drainage authority finds that the records are lost, destroyed, or otherwise incomplete, it may, by order, reestablish records.
- The reestablished records may define the alignment; cross-section; profile; hydraulic structure locations, materials, dimensions, and elevations; or right-of-way of the drainage system as originally constructed or subsequently improved.





Yellow Highlights Added to Show RCD 1 Alignment








